

MESSIAH

The Hebrew word, Messiah, means, "anointed", just as the corresponding Greek word "Christ" does. The word Messiah was applicable in its first sense to anyone anointed for holy office or with holy oil. Then it came to stand for an expected prince, as the references in Daniel indicate, who would redeem the chosen people from their enemies, and fulfill completely all the divine promises for them, which Christ, God's Anointed, did when He became a "Light to lighten Gentiles and glory of His people Israel." The angel at the birth of Jesus gave Him three separate titles: Savior, The promised Messiah, The Sovereign Lord of men and angels (Luke 2:11).

Green used for the background is the emblem of freshness, vigor and prosperity. It also signifies growth and fruitfulness. The white letters signify light, holiness, and purity. The banner shows a simple version to display the word Messiah. How better to describe the coming of our Messiah for how simply He came into the world.
