He is able to save: "Therefore He is able also to save forever those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them." Hebrews 7:25 (NASB)

He is born a Savior: "for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." Luke 2:11 (NASB)

He died as Savior: "We have seen and testify that the Father has sent the Son to be the Savior of the world." 1 John 4:14 (NASB)

Blue background: Speaks of heavenly things and places: symbolizes revelation.

Black World Land Masses: Denotes mourning, affliction, calamity and death. Lamentations 4:8, also Omen of evil, Zechariah 6:2.

White on World: "Come now, and let us reason together," Says the Lord, "Though your sins are as scarlet, They will be as white as snow; Though they are red like crimson, They will be like wool." Isaiah 1:17-19 (NASB)

White signifies light. "The LORD is my light and my salvation; Whom shall I fear? The LORD is the defense of my life; Whom shall I dread?" Psalm

27:1-3 (NASB). Our Savior suffered death on a cross to save a world lost in sin.

The name, Savior, and the beams of light are designed in gold to indicate brilliance, purity and symbolic of righteousness.

The Cross: The emblem of Christianity, a representation of the cross upon which Christ died. The color red is used to depict blood. The blood of Christ atones for the sin of man (1 John 1:17; Luke 22:20; Heb. 9:11-14)

Seven stones: Represent God's perfect sacrifice, His Son Jesus Christ. "Although He was a Son, He learned obedience from the things which He suffered. And having been made perfect, He became to all those who obey Him the source of eternal salvation," Hebrews 5:8-9 (NASB)

World: "God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." John 3:16 (NASB)
